



A Program for Increasing the Availability of Quality Refurbished Computers for Students with Disabilities to Use in the Home

We are pleased to announce the establishment of a new program designed to increase the availability of high-quality refurbished computers to Idaho students with disabilities in grades K thru 14 to use in the home. This program has been developed through a partnership between Computers for Kids, the Idaho State Department of Education: Special Education Team (ISDE), and the Idaho Assistive Technology Project (IATP).

Computers for Kids, Inc. (CFK) is a non-profit 501(C)(3) organization formed in 2002 that receives donated computers from individuals and businesses, then refurbishes and licenses them for distribution to students for their home use. As a part of this program, each student and the needs for home use are considered. Their mission is to offer Idaho students K to 21 the opportunity to access a variety of technological supports through their use of their own computer at home.

The IATP is the federally funded state program funded under authority of the Assistive Technology Act of 1998 as amended. The Idaho Assistive Technology Project (IATP) is a federally funded program administered by the Center on Disabilities and Human Development at the University of Idaho. Our goal is to increase the availability of assistive technology devices and services for Idahoans with disabilities. The project provides a number of assistive technology services to Idahoans with disabilities of all ages and disability categories.

Who is Eligible?

The goal of the program is to increase the availability of refurbished computers to students with disabilities within the State of Idaho. In order for a student to be eligible for these services, they must have a disability, be in grades K thru sophomore in college and live in Idaho.

The computers are being provided to students with disabilities at no cost. The partnership of the IATP/ISDE/Computers for Kids covers all fees and costs associated with processing the computers for distribution. This includes any of the computer upgrades offered by Computer for Kids with the exception of LCD (flat screen) monitors, which may be purchased by the students' family.

Technical Assistance: Computers for Kids provides technical assistance to anyone who receives a computer for one year after the distribution date. To receive this assistance, call 1-208-345-0346.
